Paul traveled to Macedonia and while there, wrote again to the Saints in Corinth (2 Cor.).

Paul journeyed to Greece, where he remained for three months.

He was about to sail to Syria but decided to return through Macedonia first (Acts 20:1-3)

Paul performed many miracles, and the Church grew.

Worshipers of the Greek goddess Diana caused the people to riot against Paul and the Christians. Gaius and Aristarchus were taken by a mob but later released unharmed. Paul remained for about three years (Acts 19:1-41).

He told them that he must go to Jerusale Tyre for Pentecost (Acts 20:13-38). 
