Latest news from Kerry:

I have been so grateful for the time I have been able to spend in the UK with family and friends over the past couple of months. I came to England at short notice in December to support my parents, as my father had been offered an operation to remove tumours from his lungs. He has had two operations and, praise God, they have been successful and he has made a full recovery from both of them. Thank you for your prayers - God has answered them!

In my last update, I asked you to pray for MT, who had recently led his pregnant wife, N, to Jesus. I am excited to say that he had the opportunity to baptise her recently. Their first child is due to be born in about 2 months' time. MT has given a Bible to one of his relatives and been sharing the gospel with his friends and acquaintances. We have been able to connect some people interested in the Gospel with him. He is enjoying learning to bring people into a fuller knowledge of the Bible and Jesus, and he is good at it too.

Keep praying for more Fulbe and other Muslims to hear and believe the Good News and then pass it on to others. We are still working towards a disciple-making movement (multiplying groups of Fulbe believers who make disciples of other Fulbe people), but we are encouraged by these small beginnings so far. We are also encouraged as God calls Cameroonian Christians to be more active in sharing the Gospel with Muslims. Their vision and intention grows along with a willingness to do what is necessary rather than continue to do what they have always done.

Give thanks:

- That Kerry has been able to spend time with her family
- That Kerry's father's surgical operations were successful
- That some of the Fulbe believers are intentionally sharing the Gospel with their people
- That the new Fulfulde Bible is being widely distributed, welcomed and read by Fulbe believers and not-yet believers

Please pray:

- For safe travel back to Cameroon on 25 February
- To be able to pick up with contacts who have been reading the Bible and wanting to learn more about Jesus
- For MT, A, S and other Fulbe believers to continue to be wise, fearless, intentional and fruitful as they share the Gospel with others
